Keep track of how long it takes each time and see if you can beat your time. <br> *Requires parent signature on page* | Sentence Sort <br> Choose 7 words and write complete sentences using those words. <br> You must have 7 complete sentences. | Memory Sort <br> Lay your words face down. Flip up two words. If they fit the same pattern you have a match. Keep playing! <br> *Requires parent signature on page* |
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| Word Hunt <br> Use a book, magazine, or newspaper \& find words that fit the pattern you are learning. Write these words on your paper under the correct category. | Blind Sort <br> Choose a partner \& have them read your words out loud. (Don't peek!) Your job is to point to the correct category as your partner calls out the words. <br> *Requires parent signature on page* | Drawing Sort <br> Use your drawing skills to sketch and label the meaning of at least 7 of your words. |

Words Their Way Language
